Athletic Newsletter for the 2008-09 Sports Seasons

Due to the ongoing renovation at Parker the entire building will be closed during the summer. Athletic cards can be turned in to the main office at **Franklin Middle School** from June 9 through August 22, 2008. Office hours are 7:30 am—Noon and 1:00 pm—3:30 pm. The athletic office will reopen at Franklin Middle School Monday, August 11th. We expect to return to Parker High School on Monday, August 25th.

Getting Ready to Play

All athletes are required to meet the WIAA eligibility requirements and those of the School District of Janesville.

Physicals / Alternate Year Cards

Athletes must have a current physical on file. A physical examination taken after April 1 is valid for the following TWO SCHOOL YEARS. Examinations taken before April 1 are valid for the remainder of that school year and the following school year. Physicals must be stamped and signed by the medical facility and physician. An alternate year card is required the school year following the year of the physical examination.

Insurance

Athletes must be covered by medical insurance. If a student does not have medical coverage, insurance can be purchased through Student Assurance Services. Applications are available in the athletic office and the main office during regular business hours. "Red" insurance cards must be completed each year.

Co-Curricular Code

All athletes and students interested in participating in a sport or other co-curricular activity must attend a co-curricular code meeting **with** a parent/guardian before they are eligible to compete in the sport or activity. **Co-curricular code meetings** are scheduled at Franklin Middle School auditorium and Marshall Middle School gym on **Monday, August 11 at 6:30 p.m.** Students and parents may attend meetings at either school. Students who have previously attended a code meeting must stop by the athletic office and resign their code card each year.

Where do I go for a Sports Physical?

Mercy Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation Center 557 N. Washington Street, Janesville, WI Mercy Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation Center is offering sports physicals just for **\$35** (cash payment only) on **Saturday, August 9 from 8:00 am until 12:00 pm. This is the only date this offer is available.** Only school sports physical forms will be completed. The physical meets WIAA requirements.

Students under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Students should wear shorts and a T-shirt. If this date does not work out for you, be sure to make an appointment with your family physician as soon as possible.

NOTE: Do not give Athletic Cards to coaches. All cards MUST be processed through the Athletic Office.

Athletic Participation Fee

The School District of Janesville has imposed a fee of \$50 per sport for athletes participating in high school athletics. The amount of this fee is subject to change prior to the start of the 2008-09 school year. The district policy provides for a possible waiver or reduction of fees under certain circumstances. 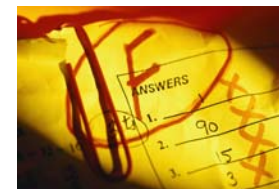

Sports Academic Eligibility

Academic eligibility guidelines apply to athletes and students participating in a sport or co-curricular activity in which competition takes place prior to the beginning of the school year. If a student received **one failing grade** in the preceding fourth grading period, the **ineligibility period** shall be **7 consecutive calendar days** beginning with the earliest allowed competition in that sport. The ineligibility period for a student receiving **more than one failing grade** in the latest grade-reporting or academic evaluation period shall be the **lesser of: (1) 21 consecutive calendar days beginning with the date of earliest allowed competition or (2) one-third of the maximum number of competitions allowed in that sport or activity rounded up if one-third results in a fraction).**

For sports in which the first date of earliest competition takes place after school starts, the regular co-curricular code ineligibility rules apply.

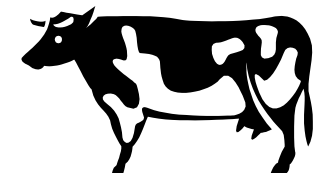
